



COVID-19 Update

November 24, 2020 18:00

A state of public health emergency is being declared by the Province of Alberta. New mandatory measures to stop the spike in cases are in effect.

For the Pincher Creek Area, the following mandatory restrictions are now in effect and will be in place for at least three weeks.

No indoor social gatherings in any setting

Outdoor gatherings max of 10

Wedding and funeral services max of 10, no receptions permitted

No festivals or events

Grades 7-12 at-home learning Nov 30-Jan 11

Grades K-6 at-home learning Dec 18-Jan 11

Working from home should be considered, where possible

The Pincher Creek area is currently classed as “open” because of our lower rate of active COVID-19 cases. Many of our neighbouring communities and all urban centres in Alberta are classified “enhanced.” We all need to be diligent in following all recommendations to keep our active case numbers as low as possible and remain in the open status. Moving to enhanced measures will further restrict our local economy, businesses, and social life.
